
Be sure there is a place at the table for you in Kay Park Parish Church. You

may not have been to church for many weeks or many years. There is no judgement awaiting you, only welcome. As we enter the season of Lent, you will be prompted to 'come back' and find your place amongst us.

As I write it is the day after Ash Wednesday, 14 February. Last night about 40 (seems to be the number of the moment) people gathered for a special service at Kay Park Parish Church to mark the beginning of Lent. Through words, silence, song, palm ashes and the bread and wine of Communion we were challenged to return to God and walk with Jesus in the wilderness, recalling Jesus' 40 days and nights in the desert (see Matthew chapter 4 v 1 - 11).

The words 'wilderness' and 'desert' do not evoke the most appealing places to be. We think of aloneness, suffering, thirst, fear, and other 'unwelcome' experiences. The reality we affirmed on Ash Wednesday was that we do not go alone, that the One in whom we place our trust has gone before us and is with us.
