



So, as the eldest man in the house, the 10 year old will leave his mum and four siblings in the waiting room while he walks home to gather sticks and light the fire, to make it more welcoming for them.

This family has little money, barely enough for food, Gedeon's mum is not happy about the holidays because the children miss their school meals.

The shoeboxes are a huge help to families in need.

Gedeon's family spent much of the Christmas holiday at the bus station to stay warm.

# Zlatko's Story

63 year old Zlatko was searching through other people's rubbish in the city of Kragujevac, when he was approached by David Armus from Blythswood Serbia. I'm looking for something to eat he explained to David and maybe some things that could be useful to me.

Zlatko lives with his brother in very poor conditions, says David remembering that December afternoon distributing shoeboxes. You can imaging how much your gifts meant to him—a warm hat, scarf, gloves, sweets and hygiene products. He was so grateful.

"Toni met a woman in her home country of Jamaica who persuaded her to give up everything and move to the UK to be with her. Their love story turned out to be a lie and Toni was kept as a Modern Slave for years until she got help from The Salvation Army."

"Victoria had a comfortable life with her partner for 7 years and then lost everything when her partner died. She started living in a park which was a huge shock, within a space of months she had lost everything and the loss of her partner brought back all her feelings of loss from years ago. She started drinking in her 20's to cope with the loss of most of her family, she was a functioning alcoholic. She went to the Salvation Army who saved her, they gave her a room and eventually the barriers came down and she stopped isolating herself. She is now working on gaining employment and having her own place."

We can support our own local Salvation Army this Christmas by continuing to give to the food bank and also giving to the Toy Appeal so that children and young people will have something to open this Christmas and those in desperate need will have food to enjoy not just on Christmas Day but throughout the year.

Can we in Kay Park Church bring **Hope** this Christmas to our neighbours in Kilmarnock?
